
pochondriasis, or 'senility.'" Hammond makes two suggestions to help overcome this mistreatment. First, older women must develop confident self-images and an awareness of their exercise and nutritional needs, as well as an understanding of how they can benefit from social support systems. They must learn that the male physician figure who they were taught to revere and worship is not divine and should be questioned and challenged. Hammond's second suggestion, which is probably less achievable, is that the United States must


