through the snow.

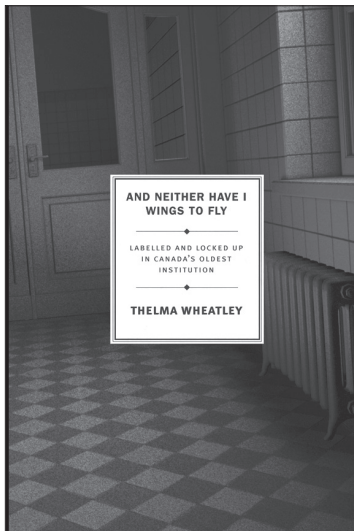
We were cold and alone
